

#### LOCATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE

The Institute shifted to its own campus at Gurgaon in 1993, located at Plot No. 76, Sector -18, Gurgaon over a plot of 7 acres of Land. HIPA is just 10 kms. away from the International Airport on the Delhi-Jaipur Highway.

The Institute building has four stories and is equipped with excellent infrastructure facilities consisting of a number of class-rooms equipped with modern training aids, computer labs, spacious auditorium and conference rooms.

Library & Information Centre of the Institute is equipped with a core collection of over 25000 books in the area of Social Sciences, Management and Literature. The Centre subscribes to almost all leading Journals & Magazines of National and International repute.

Air-conditioned reading hair of the library provides conducive environment for study and research.

The Institute's hostel provides well-furnished, comfortable accommodation for about 90 trainees at one time. It has spacious dining hall, mess facilities, indoor games like Table Tennis, Billiards, Squash Court etc.

#### II OBJECTIVES

The Haryana Institute of Public Administration was established by the Haryana Government on the 1st of August, 1983 as a Society registered under the Registration of Societies Act. 1860. The core objective of the Institute is to improve the administrative ability and competence of the officers of the State in order to enhance overall administrative efficacy of the State and its

responsiveness to the needs of the public. In this regard, the institute undertakes the following activities:-

- Courses for new entrants to the All India Services, Haryana Civil Service, Tehsildars and various allied services of the State Government.
- b) In-service refresher courses for officers of the State Government.
- In-service training related to the theory and practice of public administration to IAS officers of the Haryana cadre and HCS officers.
- Subject specific short-term in-service training programmes for officers of different departments of the State Government.
- (e) Need-based Training Programmes for various Corporations/Boards and other autonomous bodies of the State Government and Central Government.
- (f) Training Courses for Ministerial Staff to improve the efficiency of officials right at the cutting edge level, the Institute also conducts training for supervisory level and class III employees of the State Government through its Secretariat Management School (SMS) Gurgaon and Divisional Centre (DTC), Panchkula.
- (g) Conduction of training programmes sponsored by DOPT, Government of India such as 1-week/3-weeks in-service training programmes for IAS officers. In addition, some training programmes on subjects sponsored by various other National and International Agencies are also conducted.
- (h) Seminars and Workshops to facilitate frequent interaction among the administrators, academicians and professionals on various subjects of interest.
- (i) Undertake, promote and co-ordinate research, case studies and training in the fields of Public Administration and Management either on its own or in collaboration with other agencies including Universities and training institutions of the Government of India as well as the State Government.
- j) Undertake publication of newsletter and research papers.
- Participate in the organization of conferences, seminars and workshops on specialized areas of Public Administration.

#### III ORGANISATIONAL SET-UP

The Haryana Institute of Public Administration is the apex administrative training Institute of the State funded mainly by the Government of Haryana. The Chief Minister of the State heads the Governing Body. A managing committee

called the Executive Council, headed by the Chief Secretary of the Government, oversees the critical activities of the Institute.

The Principal Training and Administrative Officer of the Institute is the Director General who is directly responsible for the efficient management of the Institute and the pursuit of its avowed objectives in relation to training of officers, action research in Public Administration, appraisal of Government policies and programmes as well as advocacy of best practices in governance.

The Institute's professional structure consists of the following core faculties:-

Each faculty functions with considerable autonomy and flexibility and is responsible for designing, developing and carrying out training programmes, research and consultancy.

The Institute maintains a permanent core faculty of well-qualified and experienced members, while subject specialists and management experts are invited as guest faculty from time to time.

#### Research and Consultancy

The Institute undertakes, promotes and coordinates research and analytical studies on its own and in collaboration with other Government and Non-government organisations. The research and consultancy services offered by the Institute basically aim at problem diagnosis, preparation of action plans and redesigning and restructuring systems. The institute offers research and consultancy in the following areas:

- Monitoring and Evaluation.
- Survey Research.
- Organisational Change.
- Strategic Economic Planning (Power Sector, Local Institutions etc.)
- Social Sector Re-engineering: (Health, Gender Issues and Education.)
- System Study, Design and Development.
- Library Organisation & Automation.

#### VIII TRAINING ACTIVITIES

1. HIPA organises specialised as well as generic training programmes for Class I and Class II officers of the State as well as the Central Government. These training programmes include service-entry training in the form of foundation courses as well as in-service training programmes of short and long-term duration. In addition to this, HIPA also organises courses for secretarial and ministerial staff through the Divisional Training Centre, Panchkula and Secretariat Management School, Gurgaon. HIPA also has a specialised training centre catering to the training needs of Excise and Taxation Officers of the Government of Haryana.

- Further HIPA has instituted a Chair on Urban Development in collaboration with the Human Settlement Management Institute (HSMI) under the aegis of the Housing and Urban Development Corporation (HUDCO).
- During the period 1.4.2006 to 31.3.2007, the institute conducted 265
   Training Courses (as given in Table IV below).

- 4. On a comparative plan, it is pointed-out that the Haryana Institute of Public Administration organized 265 Training courses during 2006-2007 through which training was imparted to 8078 officers/officials of various Government Departments/ Organisations, as compared to 264 courses during 2005-2006 in which 5643 trainees participated.
- 5. During the financial year 2005-2006, the Institute conducted 15 long duration courses, 137 short duration courses and 2 workshops/seminars. In addition, Divisional Training Centre, Panchkula conducted 66 short duration courses and 23 seminars/workshops. The Excise & Taxation School conducted 19 courses. The Secretarial Management School, Gurgaon conducted 12 short duration courses and seminars/ workshops.

#### IX OTHER ACTIVITIES HELD DURING THE YEAR

#### Training Need Analysis Meet

In order to make Training Programmes more client oriented and demand driven HIPA organized a Training Need Analysis Meet at Red Bishop, Panchkula on 26<sup>th</sup> June 2006. The objective of the Meet was not only to conduct Training Need Analysis (TNA) and assess the training requirements of various Departments but also to explore areas of mutual interest and cooperation. The Departments were requested to nominate a Training Coordinator with whom the Institute could liaison in matters relating to training. All the Departments welcomed the initiative and it was felt that more such opportunities for interaction should be explored in future.

## Panel Discussion: Security Scenario in Gurgaon

HIPA in association with IIPA Gurgaon Local Branch organized a Panel Discussion on "A Perspective on Security Scenario in Gurgaon" on 29th June 2006. The discussion provided a platform for meaningful interaction between the residents of Gurgaon, the district administration, security experts and civil society organisations. Dr. G. Prasanna Kumar, Director General, HIPA highlighted the importance of the theme and also expressed the desire that HIPA would play a more meaningful role in addressing the problems of Gurgaon in particular and the State in general. Sri M.C. Gupta, former Chief Secretary, Haryana conducted

the proceedings. Mr. R.P. Bhardwaj, Deputy Commissioner, Gurgaon and Mr. Hanif Quraishi, SSP, Gurgaon, gave an overview of the security scenario in Gurgaon and also shared the concerns of the citizens of Gurgaon regarding maintenance of law and order. Mr. Shanker Sen, former DG, NHRC, Dr. U.N.B. Rao, Mr. Maxwell Pereira and others presented their views on the theme.

#### Director General Visits C G G

Dr. Prasanna Kumar Director General, along with Mr. Baijnath, Head, Faculty of Computer Sciences visited the Centre for Good Governance at Hyderabad. They held discussion with the officers and faculty members on the activities of the CGG. They were also briefed about the projects and consultancy assignments being taken up by the Centre. The visit was in connection with setting up of Centre for Good Governance at HIPA, Gurgaon on the lines of CGG at Hyderabad.

#### Golden Jubilee Meeting of Executive Council

The 50th Meeting of the Executive Council of HIPA was held on 15th July 2006 at Haryana Bhawan, New Delhi. Mr. Prem Prashant, Chief Secretary, Haryana Chaired the meeting. The EC approved the setting up of two new Centres at HIPA, i.e., Centre for the Study of History and Culture of Haryana and the Centre for Good Governance. Centre for the Study of History and Culture of Haryana has become operational. Centre for Good Governance would become operational very soon.

#### Haryana Human Development Report

HIPA has prepared the Haryana Human Development Report, 2005. The Report highlights that the Human Development approach with its emphasis on health attainments, educational attainments, remedial measures for eliminating gender disparity and alleviation of economic deprivations, must become the core philosophy of good governance. The various indices discussed at length in the Report, namely the Human Development Index, the Gender Equality Index and the Human Poverty Index can be used as significant tools for measuring



outcomes and assessing the performance of the bureaucracy dealing with socioeconomic development.

The Report brings out the commendable progress made by Haryana in the sphere of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and physical infrastructure in terms of electrification of all villages and towns as well as connecting all villages by pucca roads. The state is gradually improving its performance on educational and health indicators. On the whole there is still considerable scope for improvement in the spheres of social development and employment generation. The HDR Research Team was led by Dr. H. S. Ahand, former DG, and assisted by Mr. R.K.Gulati, Ms. Manveen Kaur, Ms. Aarti Dudeja and Dr. Bhuwan Kumar.

#### Chief Minister Visits HIPA

The Chief Minister, Shri Bhupinder Singh Hooda visited HIPA on 7th November to inaugurate state-level sensitization programme on "Earthquake Risk Management". The programme was tailor made for the legislative members of Haryana Assembly.

The Chief Minister announced that the state government would soon enact a law on Disaster Management on the Central pattern. Sh. Hooda also said that two companies of the Haryana Police were being specially trained for Disaster Management. He emphasised that the foundations of buildings should be designed and constructed as per the National Building Code. Sh. Hooda also praised HIPA for organising such sensitization programme.

The Chief Secretary, Shri Prem Prashant and Chairperson of the HIPA Executive Council informed the audience that the occasion was memorable to HIPA as the CM is also the President of HIPA Society. He also informed that HIPA started working on Disaster Management issues on 1st July, 1994 as a Central Scheme.

#### Pathways of Right to Information Act

HIPA has been cruising along the RTI highway for a while IC Centre for Governance in association with HIPA organized a RTI Seminar on 17 November 2006 in the Conference Hall of the New Secretariat in Chandigarh. Shri Prabhat

Kumar former Cabinet Secretary, Govt. of India, Mr. Trilochan Singh and Ms. Kiran Agarwal, retired IAS of Haryana cadre, Shri G. Madahvan, Chief Information Commissioner, Haryana and Smt. Meenaxi Anand Chaudhary, State Information Commissioner in a mutually reinforcing manner underscored the seminal importance of RTI Act in Haryana. Prof. Suresh Misra made a thought provoking presentation on "Capacity Building (CB) in RTI" and highlighted the role of HIPA in such CBs.

HIPA organised another seminar on Right to Information on 7<sup>th</sup> February, 2007 in association with IIPA Local Branch, Gurgaon as part of the initiatives taken by HIPA to create awareness about RTI Act and its various provisions.

The seminar was attended by nearly 150 participants from various walks of life. The Chief Information Commissioner, India, Mr. Wajahat Habibullah interacted with the participants and clarified a number of provisions of the Act. The interactive session proved to be very useful and was appreciated by one and all. HIPA will be organising more such interactive sessions with various stakeholders.

HIPA in association with the Department of Administrative Reforms, Haryana has been organizing Awareness Workshops on RTI in various districts of the State. More than 2500 SPIOs and ASPIOs have been covered so far by this CB programmes anchored by Prof. Suresh Misra, Dr. Rajveer S. Dhaka and Mr. Ram Saran.

#### Capacity Building of College Teachers in Consumer Protection and Welfare

During 21-25 August 2006 IIPA and HIPA came together to organise a 'Capacity Building Programme in 'Consumer Protection and Welfare'. The Department of Consumer Affairs, Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, Government of India sponsored this programmed attended by 32 college teachers from various districts of Haryana.

#### Revisiting Entrepreneurship Development

The Consultative Committee meeting (29 August 2006) of the Centre for Entrepreneurship Development (CEDO) saw about 20 experts from government, Industry and professional bodies converging at HIPA. The outcome was a new roadmap for CEDO in a partnership mode with various stakeholders.

#### Outsourcing experiment in HIPA

Since early November HIPA has consciously introduced an experiment in outsourcing the kitchen activities and the canteen facility. The Landscaping and Watch & Ward activities have also been outsourced. This has helped HIPA faculty and staff to concentrate more on the training aspects leaving much of the non-training activities to experts in the respective areas.

#### HIPA in Montpellier, South France

Prof. J. George represented HIPA at the International Workshop on Geographical Indicators during 6-8 September 2006. Prof. J. George contribute a paper entitled "Geographical Indication in India: Socio-Economic Development Issue in Agriculture" for the International Seminar. This paper is available on the SINER-GI website as well as at http://hipa.nic.in/igeorge.html.. Prof. J. George gave a written and oral submission at the third and probably last meeting (16 November) of the Agriculture Working Group set up by the Planning Commission for the Eleventh Five Year Plan. Prof. J. George delivered an invited lecture on "SPS and TBT" at the CUTS Interactive meeting on "Challenges and Opportunities from a possible India-EUFTA" on 8 November at the India International Centre Conference Hall. #### Gender Budgeting

A one-day workshop on "Gender Budgeting" was inaugurated by Sh. Prem Prashant, Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana at Red Bishop, Panchkula on 16th January, 2007. The Chief Secretary underscored the Government's commitment to ensure equal opportunities for all its citizens and hoped that gender budgeting would ensure adequate allocation of resources to women under all the developmental programmes. This programme was organized by HIPA for senior secretaries and Budget Officers of various departments of Haryana Government. Inputs on importance and approaches to Gender

Budgeting were also given by Mrs. Rashmi Verma and Mrs. Kanta Singh of "Women Power Connect", a Delhi based NGO.

#### Capacity Building for Poverty Reduction (CBPR)

DOPT has prepared an elaborate plan for Capacity Building for Poverty Reduction (CBPR) to be launched in the entire country. Some pilot projects have been taken up in a few States and their progress is being monitored. HIPA, Gurgaon has been nominated as the nodal agency for coordinating and monitoring the CBPR activities on behalf of DOPT. For this purpose a core group has been created in HIPA which is meeting frequently and the progress of various projects is being monitored.

This follows up on the DOPT supported CBPR workshop in HIPA, Shimla during 22-23 June 2006. A one-day Workshops of Faculty drawn from various ATIs was held on 4th August 2006 in HIPA.

Carrying forward the DOPT mandated incubating role for HIPA, a dedicated team has been constituted with Prof. J. George and Prof. Suresh Misra as Convener and Co-Convener. The team will document and analyse best practices amongst various ATIs (Administrative Training Institutes) in the country and particularly amongst ATIs in Bhopal, Chennai, Kolkata and Pune. The third Workshop following Gurgaon Workshop on 4th August, 2006 in the series of interaction was organized at RCVPN Academy of Administration and Management, Bhopal during 9-10 October 2006. A framework for generic replication of sector specific capacity building activities has been arrived.

This was followed by a detailed interaction with Master Trainers and Recognised Users (MT/RU) of the country at a Workshop in Anna Institute of Management, Chennai during 9-10 November 2006. Plenty of trainer material and ideas have been exchanged. Prof. George contributed towards a Trainer and Training Vision, 2020 during the Workshop.

#### **CBPR** Knowledge Centre

Capacity Building for Poverty Reduction (CBPR) Project in HIPA has been serving as Clearing House of Ideas in the context of training of the public

service providers. In this connection HIPA has acquired innovative programme CDs from YASHADA, Pune carried out in their Jagruti programme. These materials in the form of printed documents and multi- media soft copies have since formed integral part of the Knowledge Centre created within HIPA Library.

The first review meeting of the CBPR Core Incubating Group was held in HIPA on 1st December, 2006. The meeting was attended by experts in capacity building located in different states of India. The meeting was chaired by Sh. Vineet Pandey, Director, Department of Personnel and Training, Government of India. #### Theatre Workshop for Group C & D Employees

The main focus of attention of the CPBR programme is the group C & D employees who have hitherto been neglected as far as capacity building is concerned. Since the number of group C & D employees in any state is very big, innovative methods will have to be employed for reaching out to every such employee of the state in the shortest possible time. To gain experience in this area and also with a view to change the mindset of our own employees, HIPA has initiated a series of one day programme for the group C & D employees of the Institute. During these programmes we have observed that there is considerable hidden talent among these employees which can be harnessed for creative use. Accordingly a two week residential theatre workshop has been organized in HIPA from 27th February to 15th March, 2007, under the able guidance of Mr. M.K. Raina, a well known theatre personality and film actor who is also known for his social commitment. In this programme 24 young persons (14 males and 10 females) drawn from different government offices of Gurgaon including HIPA, Anganwari workers and NGO activists are taking part. Opportunities are given in this workshop to develop the latent creative talent present in every person.

Since there are over 2.5 lacs employees of group C & D in Haryana and since we have realized that it is not possible for HIPA to conduct the training programmes for all such employees, we plan to conduct a series of Training of Trainers programme in every district. These trainers who would be experienced

persons drawn from different departments will in turn conduct training programmes for group C & D employees under the over all supervision of HIPA faculty. It is proposed that these trainers would make use of the theatre groups trained in HIPA. These programmes will be used for changing the mindset of employees, increasing their efficiency and creating awareness about various social problems prevalent in Haryana.

#### Total Quality Management Initiatives in HIPA

HIPA has taken a number of initiatives to improve the overall working of the Institute. The focus in on improving not only the quality of programmes and their delivery but also various processes and procedures. In any improvement process the role of the employee is very important, if TQM has to be successfully implemented. Realising this fact the Institute organized an orientation workshop for all the employees of HIPA on 10<sup>th</sup> February,2007. The objective was to help the employees to understand the importance of various TQM techniques and tools which enhance productivity.
